

My name is John Bruner and I have been a member of the Indiana County 4-H Program since I joined as a Cloverbud at age 5. I've completed a lot of projects over the years but my favorite is shooting sports. This year I am focused on

completing my 4-H diamond project (the equivalent of an Eagle Scout Project). My activity will be a 2-day shooting sports day camp. Along with all the fun things campers will experience and educational skills they will learn, my diamond project has a servicelearning component. In line with the National Shooting Sports Program called Center Shot on Cereal, one of the workshops at day camp will be to discuss good nutrition as it relates to shooting sports. Iron fortified cereals build strong bones and muscles necessary for shooting strength and stamina. # Congregational Update PNC Committee Progress Report June 23, 2024

### **Committee Members:**

- 1. Open candid discussion and debate (Thursday, June 6th, 2024)
- 2. Hard work and creativity; continued sense of urgency
- 3. Shared goal for our congregation; representative of our church
- 4. <u>Our Committee prays to be led by the Holy Spirit (opening and closing prayer) and we need your prayers for support; we have experienced highs and lows</u>
- 5. Stayed committed to confidentiality to ensure fair process.

## \*\*Reminder: Two tiers of accepted Pastors:

- <u>Full Communion Partner Churches: PCUSA, Evangelical</u> <u>Lutheran Church, United Church of Christ and Reformed Church</u> in America
- <u>Letter of Correspondence Churches: World Council of Churches</u> <u>and Christian Churches Together</u>
- Or they must go through our Presbytery's full 2-Year Ordination Process/Exams

## As a Review: Five Focused Areas for Search:

- Preaching the Gospel and Authority of Scripture
- Outreach and Evangelism
- Leadership and Vision: Worship Service design/delivery, including music ministry
- Church Ministries: Youth Program
- Stewardship

• Traditional View of Marriage and Support for Women in Leadership Roles are key areas of focus

# **Steps in Process:**

- Screening
- Virtual on-line interview with PNC
- In-Person interview and visit with PNC
- Recommended Interview with PNC/Session
- Review of final candidate with Presbytery; to ensure credentials
- Finalized candidates to be brought before Congregation
- Vote by Congregation on Terms of Call
- Installation of Pastor

## **Key Work Since Last Update:**

May 8th: Initial on-site Pastoral Candidate withdrew from consideration May 9th - June 6th: Screened 23 Associate Pastors from Redstone/Butler&Beaver/Pittsburgh/Huntington Presbyteries (we received 1 interested candidate who later withdrew from consideration after receiving a new contract to serve as Director, Youth Ministry)

**June 6th:** Began contact/outreach with all Redstone Presbytery Senior Pastors (67 churches, some shared)

\*Note: As a result of this outreach effort, we have received two interested Pastoral candidates

**June 18th:** After re-engagement with first candidate; she ultimately declined further consideration position due to location/joint custody issues

**June 20th:** Conducted Virtual Interview with candidate from Redstone Presbytery

Note: Next month we are considering a non-traditional approach of utilizing the electronic billboard on Route 22 in Delmont and also utilizing advertisement on WORD FM to better publicize our Pastor position.
